Jerwood Encounters: Family Politics Curated by Photoworks

The forthcoming Jerwood Encounters exhibition, *Family Politics*, curated by **Photoworks** will show at **Jerwood Space**, **London** from **6 November – 8 December 2013**.

The exhibition will present new commissions and existing work by six early career photographers relating to 'Family Politics' - the curatorial theme of the first issue of **Photoworks Annual** which will launch alongside the exhibition. The exhibiting artists include invited artists **Claudia Sola** and **The Photocopy Club**; and artists selected from an open call, **Jonny Briggs**, **Robert Crosse**, **Nikolai Ishchuk** and **Joanna Piotrowska**. The exhibition explores the different ways in which artists consider and use photographic practice resulting in an expanded view of the medium.

As a subject, the family is both private and public: the site of intimate inter-personal relations and a social construct subject to public and political pressures. This relationship is mirrored in examples of family photography. The majority of family pictures serve essentially private functions, accruing meaning through their relationship to the memories, experiences and histories of individuals. However, the family is also the subject of public photographic representation and contestation largely through digital media and 'over sharing'. This involves a wide variety of practices, including representations in the mass media, art and advertising.

Family Politics features a variety of approaches to photography with each work drawing on photographic language as a reference point.

The exhibition coincides with the publication of **Photoworks Annual** which explores the Family Politics theme further with commissioned work from Jowhara Alsaud and Claudia Sola, Folios by Broomberg & Chanarin and John Clang; conversations between: Marianne Hirsch and Lorrie Novak, Wendy Ewald and Anthony Luvera, Bettina von Zwehl and Kelley Wylder and writings from Michael Bonesteel, Susan Bright, Terry Dennett, Geoffrey Batchen, Blake Stimson, Sarah James, Stephanie Schwartz, and Judith Habelstram, Aaron Schuman, Blake Morrison, Andrew Kötting, Sue Hubbard and David Campany amongst others.

Artist Biographies

Jonny Briggs is an artist in search of a lost childhood. Through performative installations, comic metaphor, and photomontage, Briggs creates images that re-capture childhood. Briggs graduated from the Royal College of Art in 2011 and has most recently had a solo exhibition, *Ancestral Home* at Simon Oldfield Gallery, London. jonnybriggs.com

Robert Crosse is influenced by people, conversation and the development of relationships. He creates film and video works that document and re-evaluate the world before him. Crosse graduated with an MFA from Slade School of Fine Art in 2012, and has recently exhibited as part of the group show *21st Century* (2012) at Chisenhale Gallery, London. <u>robertcrosse.com</u>

Nikolai Ishchuk explores photography's material condition within his artwork. His most recent photosculptures and mixed media works trace links between photography, visual material culture, late capitalism and architecture. Ishchuk graduated with an MA and Postgraduate Diploma in Fine Art from Chelsea College of Art, and has exhibited at Whitechapel Gallery, in *The London Open* (2012). <u>nikolai-ishchuk.com</u>

Joanna Piotrowska explores relationships between individuals through carefully arranged sculptural poses that allow the viewer to question the intimacies of those captured. Piotrowska graduated with MA Photography from Royal College of Art in 2013 and will be exhibiting at the Institute of Contemporary Arts in *Bloomberg New Contemporaries* (2013). joannapiotrowska.com

Claudia Sola is constantly searching for new ways to place daily happenings into a universal context. Her works have a strong political intention, often resulting in personal documents that reflect the way we are. Sola lives and works in Amsterdam. <u>claudiasola.org</u>

The Photocopy Club are a project based collective with the aim of bringing photography back in its physical form through the curation of regular exhibitions.
